



Rules regarding software installation.

Any login owner may request software installation at the CCC-UAM, given that the software is for general or group usage and with research goals.

The software installation requests will be attended in petition order. There will not be deadline demands to the CCC-UAM.

The installation process will only consist in enabling the software after successfully passing any operational tests given by the software manager.

The applicant has the obligation to understand the software operation.

The requested software must be legal and licensed.

For free of charge software, the CCC-UAM will administer the licenses.

For priced software, a purchase requisition may be issued to the CCC-UAM. The CCC-UAM will consider the requisition according to its financial circumstances.

In the event that the applicant wishes to deal with the costs of the software, they will need to administer the license, make the purchase and refer a copy to the CCC-UAM. The copy must include the validity period of the license. The applicant will also supply the installation media, being physical or online, with the pertinent login and password data. The applicant will inform the CCC-UAM which users are authorized to use the software in order to properly administer the access. The responsibility for the fair use of the software license by the authorized users lies with the applicant. Any modification to the use of the license must be communicated to the CCC-UAM by the applicant. The CCC-UAM is exempt from responsibility for the breach of this last point.

The CCC-UAM will not modify commercial or personal software. Authorized modifications must be performed by the interested parties in their personal directories. The CCC-UAM is exempt from responsibility for software modifications.

The compilation software will be the one in use in the CCC-UAM at the given moment. If the need for the installation of a new compiler arises as a step in the requested software installation, it will be considered as a standard software installation and subjected to the usual rules.

The right to decline the installation of software deemed illegal, detrimental or non-professional is reserved to the CCC-UAM.

The CCC-UAM renounces responsibility and ownership over the results obtained by the use of personal or commercial software, and over its use in scientific publications, patents or scientific benefit.
